Gentlemen of the Louisiana Division,



Compatriots,

It is time, once again, for the Krewe of Janus Mardi Gras parade to roll through West Monroe and Monroe. The date is February 16 and we roll around dark (6PM). This is the largest parade in the Louisiana Division that we are still welcomed at so we need to make a good showing here. We ask that you come in Confederate attire or logo and we welcome all reenactors, UDC, SCV. OCR, and Mechanized Cavalry.

Remember that we cannot throw beads or candy as the insurance we would be forced to buy is so outrageous that we cannot afford it. There will be transportation for those who cannot make the entire route (about 4.5 miles) and to get us back to the parade beginning. Bring plenty of cartridges and caps if you are going to be in the rifle company as we will be shooting around 70 times during the course of the parade. Those who aren't shooting are welcome to bring a Confederate flag and march behind the rifle company.

To get to the parade starting point exit I-20 at the Mill/Stella exit in West Monroe and go South to the first traffic signal. This should be Natchitoches Street. Turn left on Natchitoches and go a few hundred yards and you will see us across from the Ouachita Parish Health Unit. You must be there around 3:30 PM because the streets are shut down around 4:00 and you can't get to the starting point after that.

Please make the effort to attend this parade. The organizers are very friendly towards us and so is the crowd, for the most part. The organizers don't understand why our attendance has dropped off in the last couple of years and neither do I.

This is the best chance to get the colors in front of 200,000 people so let's take it!

LOUISIANA HERITAGE RIDE CONFEDERATE FLAG DAY SATURDAY, MARCH 2, 2019

National Confederate Flag Day will be observed Saturday, March 2, 2019.

The Louisiana Sons of Confederate Veterans will be holding their annual "Heritage Ride" across the state of Louisiana on Confederate Flag Day, Saturday, March 2, 2019.

There will be two routes for the "Heritage Ride." (Interstate 10 & 20) As with both routes, there will be various "pick-up" areas for participants to fall into the procession along both interstates.

Route 1 will be down I-20 starting in Greenwood, LA at 8 a.m. It will run to Vicksburg then circle back toward Greenwood, LA. Pick-up areas: Greenwood, Minden, Arcadia, Ruston, Calhoun & Rayville. Route 1 will be overseen by 1st & 2nd Platoons.

This ride is open to all pro-Southern & pro-Confederate groups and individuals. We expect appropriate behavior out of all participants. All flags flown during this event will be historical. No modern day variants, messages, political or any other type banners/flags will be tolerated. Anyone who carries themselves in a way that would bring dishonor upon the memory of our ancestors or not abide by these simple rules will be asked to leave.
